STATEMENT HEAVY METALS SS21 Ink series (SPC-0501 series and SPC-0588)

and

STATEMENT SVHC

The directive on the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment 2002/95/EC; commonly referred to as the Restriction of Hazardous Substances Directive or RoHS). The RoHS directive took effect on 1 July 2006, and is required to be enforced and become law in each member state. This directive restricts the use of six hazardous materials in the manufacture of various types of electronic and electrical equipment.

According to our present information, the SPC-0501 and SPC-0588 ink series and have less than the RoHS limits for the six restricted use substances (Lead, Cadmium, Mercury, Hexavalent Chromium, PBB and PBDE). Only traces of heavy metals in certain pigments can be in place.

Conclusion:

SS21 Ink is in compliance with the RoHS directive.

SVHC

According to our present information, we herewith confirm the SS21 series, supplied by Mimaki Europe, does not contain Substances of Very High Concern (per EC Regulation No.1907/2006) as set out in the candidate list. Should any updates of this list result in a change in the situation our customers will be advised.

Conclusion:

SS21 Ink in the cartridges do not contain Substances of Very High Concern.
